Orchids of the Churchill Area

<i>Latin Name</i>	<i>Common Name</i>	<i>Blooming date</i> *	<i>Occurrence</i> **
<i>Amerorchis rotundifolia</i>	Small round leaved bog orchid	mid June to mid July	common
<i>Calypso bulbosa</i>	Eastern fairy-slipper		
<i>Corallorhiza trifida</i>	Early coralroot	mid June to mid July	frequent
<i>Cypripedium passerinum</i>	Sparrow's egg lady's-slipper	late June to late July	common in localized areas
<i>Listera borealis</i>	Northern twayblade	early to late July	very rare
<i>Listera cordata</i>	Heart-leaved twayblade	early to late July	rare
<i>Platanthera aquilonis</i>	Northern green bog orchid	early July to early August	frequent
<i>Platanthera huronensis</i>	Tall Northern Green Orchid	early July to early August	common
<i>Platanthera obtusata</i>	Blunt-leaved rein orchid	early July to early August	common
<i>Spiranthes romanzoffiana</i>	Hooded ladies'tresses	mid July to early August	common

* Note: Blooming dates of orchids in the Churchill area are dependent on weather conditions and can vary from one year to the next by several weeks.

** Occurrence

Common: expect to find this in most places within an area - don't have to look too hard to find it.

Frequent: expect to find it in most places within the area - but you will have to look to find it.

Occasional: scattered throughout the area - but not in any numbers - you may have to know the preferred habitat to find it.

Rare: expect to spend a substantial amount of time in preferred habitat to find this one.

Very rare: lady luck will have to be with you on this - even in the preferred habitat.
